AGE TO CONSUME	21
CAN MINORS BE EMPLOYED?	There is no minimum age for the employment of busboys/barbacks in an on premise licensed establishment. Must be 21 to bartend.
AGE TO SERVE	18
AGE TO POUR	21
AGE TO SELL (PACKAGED LIQUOR)	18
MINORS ALLOWED ON PREMISE?	There are no state statutes regulating the admittance of minors into licensed establishments. Minors are permitted in any establishment unless the establishment has house policies regarding admittance of minors. There may be local ordinances regarding these policies.
CAN PARENTS SERVE ALCOHOL TO THEIR MINOR CHILD?	Minors are allowed to consume alcohol only in a private residence with their parent or legal guardian. A minor can consume beer with 3.2% alcohol or less if it is provided by a parent or legal guardian so long as the parent/legal guardian is present during the consumption of the beer. A licensee, however, cannot allow a minor to consume alcohol on the licensed premises regardless of whether the minor's parents are present or not.
HOURS OF SERVICE	On-Premise Establishments Sunday through Saturday: 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 a.m. Off Premise / Retail Stores Sunday thru Saturday 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Local ordinances may further restrict.
ACCEPTED ID'S	A valid government issued photo identification. Driver's license, identification card, passport, military identification.
LEGAL LEVEL OF INTOXICATION WHILE DRIVING	.08 BAC
DRAM SHOP LAW	No
ID CONFISCATION	Kansas authority does not recommend confiscating false IDs. Licensees should notify local authorities.

Kansas (continued)

HAPPY HOUR & OTHER SERVICE RESTRICTIONS	Licensees may not offer single-priced, unlimited service drink specials or free drinks for patrons. Licensees also may not encourage or promote any organized game which awards alcohol as a prize or promotes excessive drinking. The law allows for a licensee to offer a food and drink combination for a special price dependent upon the licensee being able to articulate how much of that price was for the drink vs. the food. The same drink would have to be offered for that same price as a solo purchase for the entire day. Regardless of the terminology used, "happy hour", "drink special" and/or "promotion", all drinks have to have the same price throughout the same day/evening.
PENALTIES FOR SERVING OR SELLING TO A MINOR	Class B misdemeanor punishable by minimum \$200 fine (up to \$1,000) and possibly up to 6 months imprisonment.
WARNING SIGNS REQUIRED ON EFFECTS OF ALCOHOL ON FETUS?	No. Check local ordinances.
