

ServSafe Alcohol Program Roll-Out Guidelines:



Colorado

In Colorado, responsible alcohol service training is voluntary.

ServSafe Alcohol™ is a recognized program in Colorado. However; in order to provide training, each ServSafe instructors must get approved by the Colorado LED. And must comply with regulation 47-605 to maintain compliance and receive proper accreditation.

Once a licensee is designated a "Responsible Vendor," all new employees involved in the sale, handling and service of alcoholic beverages must complete the training within 90 days of date of hire, have at least 2 hours of instruction time and re-certify every 2 years.

The state only accepts in person classroom training and not online.

Local requirements: Boulder City have mandatory training requirements by accredited Responsible Vendor Training instructors.
