

ServSafe Alcohol Program Roll-Out Guidelines:



Nevada

In Nevada, responsible alcohol service training is mandatory; all employees who serve or sell alcoholic beverages or perform the duties of a security guard in a licensed liquor establishment in a county with a population of 700,000 or more must have a Nevada Alcohol Education Card.

The ServSafe course and exam can be used statewide however an additional proctored exam has to be taken for the mandatory training requirements.

To receive the Nevada Alcohol Education Card as required by the [Nevada Revised Statutes 369.630](#), complete these steps:

1. Take the [ServSafe Alcohol Online course with Primary Exam](#).
2. Also, individuals must register to take the ServSafe exam in person that is proctored by the [Nevada Restaurant Association](#). Proctored exam appointments are available Monday – Friday, 9:30AM - 5:30PM, and can be made via phone: (702) 878-2313, Ext. 1004 or email: education@nvrestaurants.com
3. Bring proof of your ServSafe Alcohol Certificate to your Nevada Restaurant Association proctored exam.
4. The Nevada Restaurant Association will issue the state-wide recognized and required Alcohol Education Card upon successful completion of the proctored exam.
