

ServSafe Alcohol Program Roll-Out Guidelines:



Ohio

Training in responsible alcohol service in Ohio is voluntary and is not regulated by the state.

The ServSafe Alcohol™ program is approved in Ohio.

Ohio's Division of Liquor Control does not require any forms or notification when a permit holder requires his or her staff to be certified in a responsible alcohol service training program. How and when the permit holder trains his or her staff is left completely up to the permit holder. The Division suggests maintaining a record of employee training and certification, although it is not mandatory.

Mitigating benefit: In considering whether to suspend or revoke a permit, or in issuing an order allowing a permit holder to elect to pay a fine, the liquor control commission shall consider whether the permit holder and the permit holder's employees have successfully completed an alcohol server training program.
