

## ServSafe Alcohol Program Roll-Out Guidelines:



### South Carolina

In South Carolina, responsible alcohol service training is mandatory for anyone who works at least 10 hours per week serving alcohol for on-premises consumption, as well as for managers who oversee alcohol service. [ServSafe Alcohol Online Course & Exam – South Carolina is an SCDOR-approved provider.](#)

Training must be completed within 30 days of employment. The South Carolina Department of Revenue (SCDOR) further requires that the course be delivered **exclusively online**—classroom training is not permitted. Additionally, the exam must be monitored by an online proctor. ServSafe uses a Record+ proctoring solution. Servers are required to maintain a digital or physical copy of their **ABL Server License** while serving alcohol. Licensees must also retain a digital or physical copy of each server's ABL Server License for the duration of that individual's employment. Please note that the ABL Server License is **distinct** from the ServSafe Alcohol Certificate and can only be retrieved from the SCDOR website.
