St. Tammany Parish

Hours of Operation

In St. Tammany Parish, all businesses that sell alcohol for on or off premise consumption shall close from 2:00 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. daily. Only employees are allowed to stay on the premises of an on-premise consumption outlet during the mandated closing times. Off-premise outlets are allowed to stay open but cannot sell alcohol. These closing hours do not apply on January 1, the Saturday and Monday morning proceeding Mardi Gras and Mardi Gras day itself.

Sunday Sales

In St. Tammany Parish, there are no laws prohibiting the sale of alcohol on Sundays except the daily closing hours set forth above.

Noise Regulations

St. Tammany Parish does have laws governing noise created by businesses. Generally speaking, you should not create a level of noise that can be heard by your neighbors in their homes or businesses. For specific requirements of the noise ordinance, you should consult an attorney.

Litter

You should always maintain the premises by conducting daily litter pick-ups.

Zoning

Zoning laws restrict what sort of activity can or can't occur in your establishment. For instance, many businesses are located in zoning districts that do not permit live entertainment. Please review with your manager or owner what is and is not allowed at your particular location.

Leaving premises with alcohol

No person is allowed to remove any alcoholic beverage from the premises of an on-premise consumption outlet in a container of any type, whether glass, bottle, can, paper or plastic cup, go-cup, or otherwise, unless said container is unopened and sealed.

Unopened and sealed container shall be defined as a container of any type, whether glass, bottle, can, paper or plastic cup, go-cup, or other receptacle which has not been opened, or on which a seal or stamp has not been broken, or which has a lid or seal from which a straw does not protrude.

Local Licensing of Servers and Local Server Training

Bartenders and Managers have to get "bar cards" (\$40.00) issued by the parish of St. Tammany Parish. The "bar cards" are valid for two (2) years. Also, bartenders and managers must also participate in a serving training class that entails watching videotape.

The new state law that requires servers (bartenders and managers) to attend this course also says that servers do not have to attend local server training courses if they participate in a state-approved course. Since 2000, servers have to participate in state-approved courses.

City of Covington

Hours of Operation

In Covington, all businesses that sell alcohol for on or off premise consumption shall close from 2:00 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. daily. Only employees are allowed to stay on the premises of an on-premise consumption outlet during the mandated closing times. Off-premise outlets are allowed to stay open but cannot sell alcohol. These closing hours do not apply on January 1, Mardi Gras Day and the day following any day or night parade of the Krewe of Olympia or any other properly sanctioned and permitted night Mardi Gras Parade within the City of Covington.

Sunday Sales

In Covington, there are no laws prohibiting the sale of alcohol on Sundays except the daily closing hours set forth above.

Covington does have laws governing noise created by businesses. Generally speaking, you should not create a level of noise that can be heard by your neighbors in their homes or businesses. For specific requirements of the noise ordinance, you should consult an attorney.

Owners of on-premise outlets must post a conspicuous notice inside the premises as well as by each exit stating that it is illegal to remove any alcoholic beverage in an open container.

City of Mandeville

Hours of Operation

In Mandeville, all businesses that sell alcohol for on or off premise consumption shall close from 2:00 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. daily. Only employees are allowed to stay on the premises of an on-premise consumption outlet during the mandated closing times. Off-premise outlets are allowed to stay open but cannot sell alcohol. These closing hours do not apply on January 1, the Saturday and Monday morning proceeding Mardi Gras and Mardi Gras day itself.

Local Licensing of Servers and Local Server Training

Bartenders and Managers have to get "bar cards" (\$40.00) issued by the parish of St. Tammany Parish but valid in the City of Mandeville. The "bar cards" are valid for two (2) years. After receiving a "bar card" you must also register with the City of Mandeville (\$2.00). Also, bartenders and managers must also participate in a serving training class, which entails watching a videotape.

The new state law that requires servers to attend this course also says that servers do not have to attend local server training courses if they participate in a state-approved course. By 2000, you will have to participate in state-approved courses.

City of Slidell

Hours of Operation

In Slidell, all businesses that sell alcohol for on or off premise consumption shall close from 2:00 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. daily. Only employees are allowed to stay on the premises of an on-premise consumption outlet during

Slidell does have laws governing noise created by businesses. Generally speaking, you should not create a level of noise that can be heard by your neighbors in their homes or businesses. For specific requirements of the noise ordinance, you should consult an attorney.

You should always maintain the premises by conducting daily litter pick-ups.

Zoning

Zoning laws restrict what sort of activity can or can't occur in your establishment. For instance, many businesses are located in zoning districts that do not permit live entertainment. Please review with your manager or owner what is and is not allowed at your particular location.

Leaving premises with alcohol

No person is allowed to remove any alcoholic beverage from the premises of an on-premise consumption outlet whether in a container made of glass, bottle, can, paper or plastic cup, go-cup, or otherwise unless said container is unopened and sealed.

Containers such as glass, plastic, and go cups, which are not sealed by the manufacturer, shall have the minimum seal consisting of tape attaching the lid to the cup. Lids shall either contain no perforation for the insertion of a straw or any such perforation shall be sealed with tape.

Bartenders and Managers have to get "bar cards" (\$40.00) issued by the parish of St. Tammany Parish but valid in the City of Slidell. The "bar cards" are valid for two (2) years. Also, bartenders and servers must also participate in a serving training class, which entails watching a videotape.

The new state law that requires servers to attend this course also says that servers do not have to attend local server training courses if they participate in a state-approved course. By 2000, you will have to participate in state-approved courses.
