Winn Parish

Hours of Operation

In the Parish of Winn, licensed beverage establishments may sell and/or serve alcoholic beverages between the hours of 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Sunday Sales

In the Parish of Winn, the sale of alcohol is prohibited on Sundays.

Noise Regulations

Generally speaking, you should not create a level of noise that disturbs your neighbors. For specific requirements of the noise ordinance, you should consult an attorney.

Litter

You should always maintain the premises by conducting daily litter pick-ups.

Zoning

Zoning laws restrict what sort of activity can or can't occur in your establishment. Please review with your manager or owner what is and is not allowed at your particular location.

Local Licensing of Servers and Local Server Training

The state law requires servers to attend a state-approved course and receive a Responsible Vendor Server Permit.

City of Winnfield

Hours of Operation

In the City of Winnfield, it is illegal to sell or serve alcohol between the hours of 10:30 p.m. and 6 a.m. on weekdays and from 10:30 p.m. on Saturday until 6 a.m. the following Monday. If the main thing sold by the business is alcohol, only the proprietor and his employees may remain on premise for the purpose of cleaning, stocking and other work and the doors must be locked and all lights turned off. Religious, fraternal and social clubs with a tax-exempt status may sell alcohol by the drink for on-premise consumption to members and

guests between the hours of 1 p.m. and 9 p.m. on Sunday. During prohibited times, it is illegal to display opened bottles of alcohol. It is also illegal to sell or serve alcohol on any of the following holidays: January 1, New Year's Day; the last Monday in May, Memorial Day; July 4th, Independence Day; the first Monday in September, Labor Day; November 11, Veteran's Day; the fourth Thursday in November, Thanksgiving Day and December 25, Christmas Day.

Sunday Sales

In the City of Winnfield, there are laws prohibiting sale of alcohol on Sunday. See the above section for details.

Noise Regulations

The City of Winnfield does have laws governing noise created by businesses. Generally speaking, you should not create a level of noise that disturbs your neighbors. For specific requirements of the noise ordinance, you should consult an attorney.

Litter

You should always maintain the premises by conducting daily litter pick-ups.

Zoning

Zoning laws restrict what sort of activity can or can't occur in your establishment. Please review with your manager or owner what is and is not allowed at your particular location.

Leaving premises with alcohol

In the City of Winnfield, it is illegal to sell or consume alcoholic beverages on any public park, playground, street, building, sidewalk, school building, school grounds, football stadium, gymnasium, skating rink, bowling alley, theater, pool hall, dance hall or amusement center.

Local Licensing of Servers and Local Server Training

The City of Winnfield anyone who works selling or serving alcohol must get an Alcoholic Beverage Handling Card from the Mayor's office. The cost of the permit is \$10. The permits are good for a period of one year. Owners of licensed establishments must notify the Department of Public Safety of the name and address of holders of alcoholic beverage handling employee cards immediately after employment.

The City of Winnfield does not require any form of local server training.

The new state law that requires servers to attend this course also says that servers do not have to attend local server training courses if they participate in a state-approved course. By 2000, you will have to participate in state-approved courses.

Other Regulations

In the City of Winnfield, every business that sells or serve alcohol must display a sign that states that no beverage of high or low alcohol content will be sold or dispensed to persons under 18 years of age.

In the City of Winnfield, an employee of a licensed establishment may not, in any way, solicit drinks for themselves or any other employee from any patron.

In the City of Winnfield, bars must post a price list on the bar in a conspicuous place or on pamphlets or cards placed on all the bars and tables in the establishment. If the price list is on each table, the licensee is responsible to make sure that each table does in fact have a price list on it. If the bar list is used alone, the letters of the sign must be at least one inch high.
