PENALTIES FOR SERVING OR SELLING TO A	1st offense: 30 days to one year. Providing alcohol to a person under 18 is a
MINOR	Class 1 misdemeanor punishable by a maximum of 1 year imprisonment
	and/or \$1000 fine. Providing to a person 18 to 20 is a Class 2 misdemeanor
	punishable by a maximum of 30 days imprisonment and/or \$200 fine and
	driving privileges revoked or restricted.
	2nd offense: 60 days to one year. Purchasing alcohol for a person under 21 is
	a Class 1 misdemeanor punishable by a maximum of 1 year imprisonment
	and/or \$1000 fine.
