

ServSafe Alcohol Program Roll-Out Guidelines:

Georgia and Macon-Bibb County, GA



Georgia is a voluntary state for responsible alcohol service training.

Macon-Bibb County, GA

Macon-Bibb county ordinance requires that alcohol handlers have an Alcohol Handler's License. Alcohol handlers include, but are not limited to:

- Anyone that works as an employee or independent contractor for a business that earns less than 50% of its gross annual revenues from the sale of food, and whose normal job duties include pouring, mixing, or opening alcohol beverages for sale by the drink.
- Anyone supervising or managing any person whose normal job duties include pouring, mixing, or opening alcoholic beverages.

Macon-Bibb County alcohol handlers must complete an approved responsible alcohol service training course and get an Alcohol Handler's License by completing this [application](#).

ServSafe™ Alcohol is an approved training program in Macon-Bibb, Georgia when using the [Macon-Bibb Georgia Supplement](#) .

Georgia Alcohol & Tobacco Division states that other jurisdictions may have their own guidelines or requirements. Please contact the county or municipal liquor authority where you operate an establishment to verify if there are county training requirements.
